Stationary bus catches fire

A fire broke out on a stationary BEST bus at the Marve bus station on Friday morning. No injuries were reported in the mishap which occurred around 8.2am. The CNG-powered vehicle involved in the accident belongs to the Malad bus depot. According to the initial reports, the bus was stationary when it suddenly caught fire, believed to have been caused by a gas leak from the engine. Two fire brigade vehicles were dispatched and the blaze was brought under control before it could spread further. Subsequently, the charred bus was towed to the Malad depot for inspection.

Frauds dupe woman of ₹71L

A 38-year-old woman lost over ₹71 lakh after being lured with an opportunity to make easy money by giving online reviews. Notably, the scammers initially gave her ₹18,500 to gain her trust. According to the police, on March 03, the Jalgaon resident received a WhatsApp message, offering ₹1,000 to ₹1,500 commission in lieu of positive reviews for restaurants. After getting ₹18,500, the woman became confident and transferred the whopping amount in separate transactions to earn more. However, she failed to withdraw her commission later, making her realise the fraud.

IIT-B develops green concrete

Mumbai: In a breakthrough for sustainable construction, IIT-B researchers have developed RubiCrete – a form of concrete that incorporates shredded waste tyres, making it both tougher and more eco-friendly. The study, led by PhD scholar Prithvendra Singh, experimented replacing a portion of natural aggregates such as sand and gravel in concrete with rubber portions.

Cafe owner, 8 aides held for trying to grab ₹500 cr land

The Bangur Nagar police on Wednesday arrested a cafe owner, who has been booked in several cases earlier, and his eight associates for allegedly trying to grab the land of a Goregaon company and assaulting and threatening the security guards and firm officials.

According to police, the plot's market value is around ₹500 crore. The main accused, **Baba Khan**, had been arrested by the Malvani police on July 15, 2024, in an extortion case. He is said to be involved in various illegal activities. The police are now investigating whether the accused has links with the land mafia or the builder lobby.

An officer said, "Preliminary probe revealed that Khan and his associates attempted to forcibly take possession of the company's land and intended to extort money." Three cases have previously been filed against Khan.

Bail to bldr Tekchandani in ₹423cr fraud

The special PMLA court has granted bail to builder Lalit Tekchandani, who is accused of laundering ₹423 crore collected from prospective flat buyers. The court granted relief, observing that "prolonged incarceration cannot be permitted to convert into pre-trial detention without any proceedings concluding in near future".

Tekchandani's lawyer,

Taraq Sayed, had pleaded that his client is in custody since March 18, 2024, with no progress in trial. The defence claimed that as per the rule, the trial in the predicate offence and the money laundering case has to go together. However, the same will take long to progress, given the sheer number of witnesses, argued Sayed.

There are 36 witnesses in the money laundering case, 42 in the first scheduled offence registered with the Chembur

police and a whopping 526 in the offence filed with the Talaja police, the defence pointed out. It added that there is no chance that the trial will be completed in the near future.

According to the ED, Tekchandani is a director of M/s Supreme Construction and Developers Pvt Ltd and the firm 56,980 sq m of land in Talaja during 2008-09. It started developing a residential project under a rental housing scheme floated by the

state government. Despite collecting hundreds of crores from buyers, the accused is yet to give flat possession, which was promised in 2016. The defence informed that the project is 75% completed.

ED prosecutor Arvind Aggarwal, objected to the bail plea, however, the court said that the application is not filed on case merits but on the ground of long incarceration.

The court noted that the agency has requested for framing of charge and pro-

ceeding further with the trial. "It appears that the draft charge was given only with an intention to see that the applicant should not be released on bail on the ground of delay in proceeding further with the trial," the court said.

The fact remains that no intimation has been filed on record by the ED intimating that the probe has been completed in all respects and it does not intend to file any supplementary complaint, it added.

BMW driver killed after collision with dumper on Atal Setu

A 28-year-old man from Chembur was killed after his BMW car rammed into a dumper on Atal Setu early Friday morning. The dumper driver also sustained injuries and is currently undergoing treatment. The impact was so intense that the four-wheeler got crushed and lodged into the dumper.

According to the Sewri police, the fatal mishap took place around 2am near pole no 8.1. The deceased, Puneet Singh Majra, was headed toward Panel when his car rammed into the dumper's end. The force of the collision caused severe injuries to his head and multiple parts of his body. He was rushed to a hospital in Kamathe, where he was declared dead during treatment.

Preliminary police investigation suggests that over-speeding and negligent driving on Majra's part led to the accident. The dumper was moving in the same lane when the car, travelling at high speed, failed to maintain safe distance and crashed into it, said the officials.



Based on the dumper driver's statement, a case has been filed against the deceased for rash and negligent driving. However, the police are also examining CCTV footage and awaiting the vehicle's technical inspection report to determine if any mechanical failure contributed to the crash.

Corrupt registrars be kept away from redypt process: MGP

The Mumbai Grakah Panchayat (MGP), in a press statement on Friday, demanded an end to the involvement of cooperative registrar offices in the selection of developers for the redevelopment of old buildings.

The state has invited suggestions from stakeholders vis-à-vis the proposed amendments to the rules governing cooperative housing societies under the Maharashtra

Cooperative Societies (MCS) Act. The MGP has also submitted recommendations concerning redevelopment, including the issue of rampant corruption in the registrar's office in the process of selection of developers.

Key MGP suggestions Section 79(A), MCS Act

The comprehensive guidelines on redevelopment issued on July 4, 2019, under section 79(A) of the MCS Act, 1961, be formally incorporated into the rules. The MGP has stated that doing so will help resolve the longstanding controversy whether these are mandatory or merely advisory in nature.

Role of registrar

Currently, a representative from the registrar's office must be present during the special general body meeting to select a developer for redevelopment with a view to ensure that the process is transparent and free of malpractice or coercion.

However, the MGP has highlighted the widespread misuse of this provision. It has alleged that the registrar's office demands bribes ranging from ₹25,000 to ₹40,000 per flat in exchange for approval for the special general body meeting and the subsequent NOC. Developers treating this as part of their business cost, allegedly pay these amounts to

agents of the registrar. To curb this corruption, the MGP has suggested that prior permission from the registrar for such meetings be abolished.

To ensure transparency in the developer selection process, the MGP has proposed to retain the requirement for video recording of the proceedings. However, the housing society should retain this recording and need not submit it to registrar. If any complaints or disputes arise, the video film serve as evidence.

Relax vote rule

Currently, a developer must receive at least 51% of the total members' votes to be selected for redevelopment. However, in situations where three developers are shortlisted in the final round, at times, none of them may receive the required 51% majority, creating a deadlock which requires the entire process to be undertaken afresh. This leads to delays which those living in dilapidated buildings cannot afford.

Hence, the MGP has suggested that if no developer receives 51% votes in the first round, the top two candidates should face a second round of voting during the same special general meeting. If neither of the two secures 51% votes even in the second round, the society should be allowed to appoint the developer with the highest number of votes.

Hybrid/e-mode provision for committee, general body meetings

During redevelopment, when buildings are demolished, members are dispersed across different locations, making it difficult to conduct committee or general body meetings in person. To solve this issue, the MGP has recommended that societies be allowed to conduct their meetings in hybrid/online modes.

Nurse booked for gold theft at IIT prof's house

A 37-year-old home nurse has been booked for allegedly stealing gold jewellery worth ₹1.4 lakh from the house, located on the campus, of an IIT-B professor. The police are searching for the accused, Madhuri Kamble, who allegedly committed the theft on May 3, her first day on the job.

According to the FIR, the complainant, Pradnya D, 60, a homemaker, resides at IIT-B, Powai, with her husband, who is a professor at the institute. Her 36-year-old mother-in-law suffers from age-related health issues and hence the family had employed a home nurse, Savita Kamble, 35, who was with them since January 2020. When she left for her native on May 3, the professor's family contacted a homecare agency and hired

Madhuri, who joined the same day.

The theft is believed to have occurred when she was massaging the elderly woman. The missing valuables include a chain, pendant, earrings, and a diamond ring. After discovering the theft the next day, the family thoroughly checked the room and contacted Madhuri when they could not find the ornaments. Her evasive responses further raised suspicions, said the family.

According to the officials, the professor initially reported the matter to the IIT security department before filing a formal police complaint. A case has been registered against Madhuri under section 306 (theft committed by a clerk or servant in possession of their employer's property) of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita.

Airport levies hiked UDF

Mumbai: The revised user development fee (UDF) for passengers flying from the Mumbai airport came into effect on Friday. The hiked fee, included in the ticket cost, will make flying costlier. Under the revised tariff,

domestic outbound passengers will have to pay ₹875 as UDF, while international outbound flyers will be charged ₹815. Arriving domestic and international passengers will pay ₹875 and ₹2,600, respectively.
