**Flower show from Feb 6**

**Mumbai:** As the city shows welcome signs of spring, the BMC and the Tree Authority are set to host the Mumbai Flower Show 2026, a three-day floral celebration at the Veermata Jijabai Bhosale Botanical Udayan and Zoo (Byculla Zoo) from February 6-8. Entry to the festival is free. It will feature around 5,000 plants, including a wide variety of flowering plants, fruit-bearing trees and medicinal species. One of the key attractions this year will be the display of 13 national symbols recreated through floral arrangements, adding both visual appeal and educational value to the event. There will be stalls offering gardening tools, plants, fertilisers and supplies. For those interested in hands-on learning, workshops will be conducted on all three days, with a participation fee of Rs 1,000.

**NEET PG Round 3 put on hold**

**Mumbai:** The Medical Counselling Committee (MCC) has put NEET-PG round three choice filling and locking on hold as the revised eligibility criteria case remains sub-judice in the Supreme Court. The earlier schedule ending January 30 has been withdrawn. The MCC said updated details will be announced soon and advised candidates to check the official website. Meanwhile, students get more time to choose preferences.

**Bar owner held in cop-link case**

**Mumbai:** In the alleged theft and extortion case involving RCF police Anti-Terrorism Cell (ATC) personnel, the Mumbai police have arrested Navi Mumbai-based bar owner Ramesh Shetty alias Ramesh Anna. His arrest follows the earlier arrest and suspension of four ATC personnel attached to the RCF police station. Previously, assistant police inspector Vijay Sutar, head constable Yogesh Khandge, and police constables Nemade and More were arrested on allegations that they stole cash and gold ornaments during raids conducted to identify Bangladeshi nationals allegedly residing illegally in Navi Mumbai. The Chembur police are probing the case.

Khan had approached the court following allegedly "scandalous, false, and grossly

defamatory" statements made by Kashyap against him and his family members in various video interviews aired on the "Bollywood Thikana" channel, owned by Hazare.

In those interviews and videos, Kashyap is alleged to have used offensive language and accused the family of running a cartel to destroy careers. There are allegedly 26

such video interviews and podcasts released between September and December 2025, which are at the centre of the controversy.

In the suit filed through advocate Pradeep Gandhi, Khan sought a permanent injunction and Rs 9 crore in damages for the comments made by Kashyap and others against him and his family.


Unauthorised hawkers remain a persistent civic challenge across Mumbai, affecting pedestrian safety, traffic flow and access to essential services. Despite repeated eviction drives, footpaths, junctions and roads in crowded commercial and residential areas, particularly near railway stations, continue to be encroached upon.

The issue recently came into focus again after a violent clash between three BJP

workers and hawkers in Kurla. The altercation, which reportedly began over a parking space, escalated into an assault, leaving three people critically injured. The January 18 incident highlighted the growing dominance of unauthorised hawkers, often alleged to be protected by organised hawking mafias.

Earlier, the Clean Heritage Colaba Residents Association approached the Bombay High Court seeking removal of illegal hawkers from Colaba Causeway. However, residents claim that despite court orders, hawkers continue to occupy the footpaths, spoiling the heritage precinct.

In many cases, hawkers return within hours of eviction. After a BEST bus accident near Bhandup railway station that killed four people, the BMC cleared encroachments. However, hawkers soon resumed business.

**Sion ROB work delayed; July 15 set as new deadline**

The deadline to complete the long-delayed Sion East-West railway overbridge (ROB) – originally set for May 31 – has been extended to July 15.

Since its closure in August 2024, the century-old bridge in front of Sion station has caused disruption and daily inconvenience. In the meantime, a foot overbridge on the Sion bridge has been opened to facilitate east-west pedestrian movement.

Moreover, of the two proposed public underpasses (PUP), one has been completed and is scheduled to become operational soon, said a civic official.

The BMC is carrying out construction of the Sion bridge within the railway limits, including the approach road, two PUPs, and other associated works. To expedite the work, the civic authorities

have instructed all engineers concerned to be present on-site daily. Additional municipal commissioner (projects) Abhijeet Bangar along with the officials of the bridge department inspected the site on Friday.

Bangar said the PUP on LBS Road has been completed and the construction of the second PUP on the Dharavi side is underway. The northern portion of the old railway bridge has been dismantled, and work on the southern portion is in progress.

He said, "Once a girder is launched on the northern half, the eastern approach road will come under BMC control. The railway administration is expected to install the final girder by May 31, by that time the west-side work will be complete. East-side work will take an additional 30-45 days, with the entire flyover expected to be finished by 15 July."

**Bail for Kamaal Khan in firing case**

In the Oshiwara firing case, the Andheri Magistrate Court granted actor Kamaal R Khan temporary cash bail of Rs 25,000 on Friday. Arrested last week by Oshiwara police, Khan was released from Arthur Road Jail on Friday after the order.

The actor's lawyer, Sana Raees Khan, had contended the arrest was "illegal, arbitrary and contrary to law". She cited a failure to serve a mandatory notice under the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023, and stated her client was not informed of the specific grounds for his arrest.

In her submissions, the lawyer challenged the prosecution's case on multiple fronts. She argued that no ballistic report or forensic opinion connects the alleged recovered bullet to Khan's licensed firearm.

Highlighting that the effective range of the weapon is approximately 20mt, she noted the distance to the complainant's location exceeds 1,500mt, calling the alleged act "physically and practically impossible".

Lawyer Khan stated no motive was established and that the allegation stemmed from a "hearsay witness", whose name was absent from the police remand report, calling the claim "absurd and false".

**Non-functional ICU at Mulund hospital: Cong morcha today**

The Maharashtra Pradesh Congress Committee (MPCC) will hold a gate meeting and morcha at Smt MT Agarwal Municipal General Hospital in Mulund West today, to protest the continued non-operation of Intensive Care Unit (ICU) services more than 45 days after the hospital's inauguration. Rakesh Shankar Shetty, MPCC spokesperson and general secretary, alleged deliberate mismanagement in the functioning of the hospital.

According to Shetty, the 470-bed civic hospital – rebuilt at a reported cost exceeding Rs 470 crore – was inaugurated in mid-December 2025 and projected as a state-of-the-art super-specialty facility catering to Mulund and surrounding areas. However, he claimed that several critical services, including the ICU, have yet to become operational.

Shetty alleged that critically ill patients are being referred to distant hospitals such as Sion Hospital, leading to treatment delays, increased health risks, and severe financial strain on families. He pointed out that the impact is especially harsh on economically weaker sections that rely on public healthcare facilities.

Issuing a warning to the authorities, Shetty said that failure to make ICU services fully operational within the next 50 days would expose the government's lack of commitment to public health. He added that the Congress would intensify its agitation until responsibility is fixed and corrective action is taken.
